

Community Engagement Findings Report (External Document)

31/03/2021

Project background

Caraleena Drive Park is being developed into a local park for the community - comprising a playground, social area, path network and open space with trees and planting.

The purpose of the engagement was to:

- Seek feedback from the community about the upcoming development;
- Determine how the community would like to use the space;
- Determine the preferred playground features;
- Gain feedback on the Landscape Layout Plan to inform detailed design.

The initial round of consultation ran from Wednesday 10 June - Friday 10th July 2020.

Methodology

The below table outlines the various methods and techniques used to engage with the community.

Summary of feedback

The below table outlines the summary of feedback - including what comments / requests were received and how they have been incorporated into the project.

Question 1: How would you like to use Caraleena Drive Park? (Answers were selected from a predetermined list)	 Answers received in order of preference were: Walking / running (23 votes) Using playground equipment (20 votes) Relaxing (11 votes) Informal ball games (9 votes) Cycling (9 votes) Socializing (7 votes) Exploring (4 votes) 	The most popular activities are walking / running and playground use. These are well represented in the proposed design - with a concrete path network / loop and a focal playground (refer to the Question 2 section for further details). The proposal also includes: Ample seating for relaxing and socialising, including a shelter with a BBQ and picnic setting. Large open grass area for informal ball games or relaxing. Wider concrete path for cycling connection from north to south.
Question 2: What playground features would you like to see in Caraleena Drive Park? (Answers were selected from a pre- determined list)	Answers received in order of preference were: Swings (21 votes) Nature play (19 votes) Climbing Nets (13 votes) Slide (12 votes) Tower (11 votes) Carousel/ Spinner (4 votes) Rockers (1 vote)	Based on these figures, 65-72% would like to see swings and / or nature play. Therefore, multiple swing opportunities and ample nature play have been included. 37-44% have voted for climbing nets, slides and / or a tower. To address all of these, a combination unit has been proposed. Carousels / spinners and rockers weren't popular options and are not likely to be provided.
Question 3: What do you like about the Landscape Layout Plan? Please explain your answer.	Feedback was positive, with respondents indicating that they were excited for the works and happy with the following aspects of the proposed plan: - Ample open space, that is well laid out and flexible - for both active and passive use. - Greenery – trees, planting and lawn. - The playground.	The Landscape Layout Plan was well received, so no major changes have been made to the general elements and arrangement. Responses to specific feedback / requests received for Question 3 have been combined under Question 4 below.

- Social area and enough seating.

Additional feedback provided was generally positive.

General tips / requests:

- Ample trees and plants including native or indigenous species.
- Playground equipment to cater for various ages and activities – with enough separation and good play surfaces. Provision of a flexible swing seat (not rigid).
- Open lawn area for play.
- Seating opportunities.
- Concrete paths, not crushed rock.
- No sand pit.

Specific requests:

(Note: numbers in brackets indicate how many requests / mentions the item had)

- Barbeque (20).
- Basketball hoop (19).
- Shade (15).
- Picnic setting (2).
- Drinking fountain (2).
- Bin (2).
- Car parking (12).
- Soccer / football / rugby / cricket / tennis markings or goals (14 total).
- Gym arena (12).
- Exercise equipment (2).
- Dog park (2).
- Toilet facilities (1).
- Veggie Patch (1).
- Landscaping to drain reserve (1).

Much of the feedback will be incorporated in the proposed design, including all general tips / requests listed to the left.

Please refer to the updated Landscape Concept Plan. (Note: Finer details - such as plant species, bins, signage, colours etc have not yet been shown on the plan and will be resolved during detailed design).

From the specific requests, the most popular items were a barbeque, basketball hoop and shade (shelter) – all of which have been incorporated.

Picnic settings, drinking fountain and bins will also be provided.

Some requests cannot be accommodated within this reserve (a local scale park), as they are better suited to larger parks (from district to regional level). These include:

- Specific sports pitches / markings.
 The open grass area will cater for various informal ball games.
- Exercise equipment / gym.
- Car parking.
- Dog park.
- Toilet facilities.

The adjacent drain reserve is Melbourne Water land. Potential tree planting may be considered as a separate / future project - subject to Melbourne Water discussions and approvals.

Next steps

The below table outlines the next steps for the project.

Next Steps	Comments
Stages of the project	Detailed design: From March 2021 . This is the delivery phase of the project where the design will be detailed and documented in readiness for construction. Construction: Planning to commence around September 2021. This is the stage of the project where the proposed design is built. Access to the space will be limited during construction.
