
JAMIESON WAY COMMUNITY CENTRE AND RESERVE

COMMUNITY ENGAGEMENT FINDINGS REPORT







PROJECT BACKGROUND:

The Jamieson Way Community Centre and Reserve at Point Cook includes one of Wyndham's longest running and popular community centres, tennis courts, netball courts, open space and carparking.

In the Draft Master Plan, Council is proposing a staged approach to the renewal and expansion of the centre and surrounds to meet the changing needs of the community.

The public exhibition phase, including community feedback, was held between 25 October and 1 December 2021.

The purpose of the engagement was to:

 Seek feedback from the community about the draft community centre and reserve master plan and proposed facility/reserve development. Gain community feedback as to the level of support for a compact sports venue which could accommodate sports such as badminton, volleyball and table tennis, and could also be used as a multi-purpose facility for performing arts and dancing.

With the public exhibition phase now complete, a summary of the consultation process and feedback received is provided below.

METHODOLOGY:

The below table outlines the various methods and techniques used to engage with the community.

SUMMARY OF FEEDBACK:

The community feedback provides a snapshot of local community views and opinions about the draft community centre and reserve master plan. Strong support has been expressed by respondents for an indoor sports venue and specifically, space/courts to support badminton.

Subject to Council endorsement of the master plan, the next stage would include design development, consideration of staging the works and the development of a funding strategy.

WE ASKED

WHAT IS YOUR CONNECTION WITH JAMIESON WAY COMMUNITY CENTRE RESERVE?

YOU SAID

Responses ranked – highest to lowest number received:

- I am or someone in my household is a casual user (199)
- I am or someone in my household is a regular user (106)
- I use or someone in my household uses the outdoor sporting facilities (netball / tennis) (99)
- I hire indoor space to conduct community lessons / events / activities (49)
- My child attends maternal health appointments (30)
- My child attends kinder or will be attending kinder (21)
- I hire outdoor space to conduct sports training / events (17)

WE DID

Responses indicated a high level of casual use and a good level of regular use by local households of Jamieson Way Community Centre and Reserve.

This level of use indicates a high degree of familiarity and use of the community facility and open space.

WE ASKED

HOW MUCH DO YOU THINK THAT THE MASTER PLAN ACCOMMODATES THE NEEDS OF THE POINT COOK COMMUNITY?

YOU SAID

Participants were invited to rate how much they believed that the master plan would accommodate the needs of the Point Cook community.

315 responses were received.

Of a possible rating of five stars, the average rating was 3.17.

WE DID

Responders indicated a general acceptance that the Draft Jamieson Way Community Centre and Reserve Master Plan would accommodate the needs of the Point Cook community.

WHAT DO YOU LIKE ABOUT THE PROPOSED DESIGN?

YOU SAID

Ranked in order from top preferences to bottom preferences:

- Indoor sports venue (287)
- Amenities for tennis and netball users (93)
- Outdoor areas and play space (93)
- Space for the market (79)
- Update of centre and improved flow (62)
- Additional car park (55)
- Expansion of netball courts (53)
- Additional kindergarten room (44)
- Other (43)
- Retention of open space (41)

WE DID

Feedback indicated strong support for an indoor sports venue.

Of the remaining preferences, respondents indicated an interest in amenities for tennis / netball and outdoor spaces.

Feedback will be used to influence the next phase of planning (e.g. refinement of the scope of works)

WE ASKED

WHAT ARE YOU CONCERNED ABOUT?

YOU SAID

Ranked in order from top preferences to bottom preferences:

- Not meeting community need (141)
- Overall cost of project (61)
- Impact on surrounding community (traffic etc) (55)
- Other (33)*
- Impact on open space (25)

*of the 33 responses, 9 were concerned with a reduction/removal of tennis courts and 5 indicated that badminton courts are needed/not enough badminton courts

WE DID

Feedback indicated that a high number of responders were concerned that the master plan would not meet community need.

Feedback will be used to influence the next phase of planning (e.g. refinement of the scope of works) to ensure that community preferences ensure a high degree of confidence that community need will be met.



IS THERE ANYTHING ELSE MAJOR YOU'D LIKE TO ADD?

YOU SAID


Of the 198 responses, individuals supported/requested:

- badminton space/courts (80)
- indoor/outdoor pool/aquatic centre (30)
- indoor sports hall (21)
- inclusive cultural involvement/diverse communities/all abilities, all age groups/ inclusiveness (20)

WE DID

Feedback will be used to influence the next phase of planning (e.g. refinement of the scope of works) to ensure that community preferences as outlined in the Draft Jamieson Way Community Centre and Reserve Master Plan will ensure a high degree of confidence that community need will be met.

Whilst responses in relation to indoor/outdoor pool/aquatic centre will be noted, such a facility will not be included in the master plan as it is beyond the proposed scope of work as well as not being aligned with Council's Aquatic Strategy.



NEXT STEPS:

Subject to Council endorsement of the master plan, the next stage would include design development, consideration of staging the works and the development of a funding strategy.

Subject to Council endorsement of its 2022/2023 capital works budget, by late 2022, detailed design work will be underway.






