

# POINT COOK DOG OFF LEASH AREA

## COMMUNITY ENGAGEMENT REPORT



## PROJECT BACKGROUND:

The Wyndham Dog Off-Leash Plan was endorsed by Council in February 2022. Throughout the development of the plan, Council heard from the community in Point Cook that an additional dog park was needed due to the high number of registered dogs within the area.

As such, Council identified Sidney Nolan Reserve as a potential site due to its central location and proximity to registered dogs.

Between the 19<sup>th</sup> April and 30<sup>th</sup> May Council went out for consultation on the proposed site.

The purpose of the engagement was to understand if the community supported the proposed location and seek feedback on why or why not.

A summary of the consultation process and feedback is provided below.



## METHODOLOGY:

The below table outlines the various methods and techniques used to engage with the community.

The following feedback will help to finalise the location of a new dog off leash area in Point Cook.

Why or why not?	<p>A range of feedback was received on the proposed location at Sidney Nolan Park. The key themes and concerns are detailed below:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. The reserve is too small and narrow</li> <li>2. It will impact on the landscape amenity of the park</li> <li>3. The park is well utilised by young families</li> <li>4. The park is well utilised by elderly residents</li> <li>5. It is unsafe and too close to the playground</li> <li>6. The path within the reserve is used by residents as a walk to school pick up point</li> <li>7. Too close to housing to the north of the reserve</li> <li>8. Bronhill Vista is a busy traffic thoroughfare</li> </ol>	<p>Council utilised the feedback provided for Sidney Nolan Park to ensure the new location at The Strand Park addresses the concerns of the community.</p> <p>The Strand Park was selected for the following reasons:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>a) It is a larger reserve with more space for a dog off leash park</li> <li>b) The dog off leash area will not overwhelm the reserve</li> <li>c) There is less impact on the landscaping and amenity of the reserve</li> <li>d) There is greater separation to residential housing</li> <li>e) There is a larger distance between the playground and the proposed dog off leash area</li> <li>f) There is more parking available</li> </ol>

## NEXT STEPS:

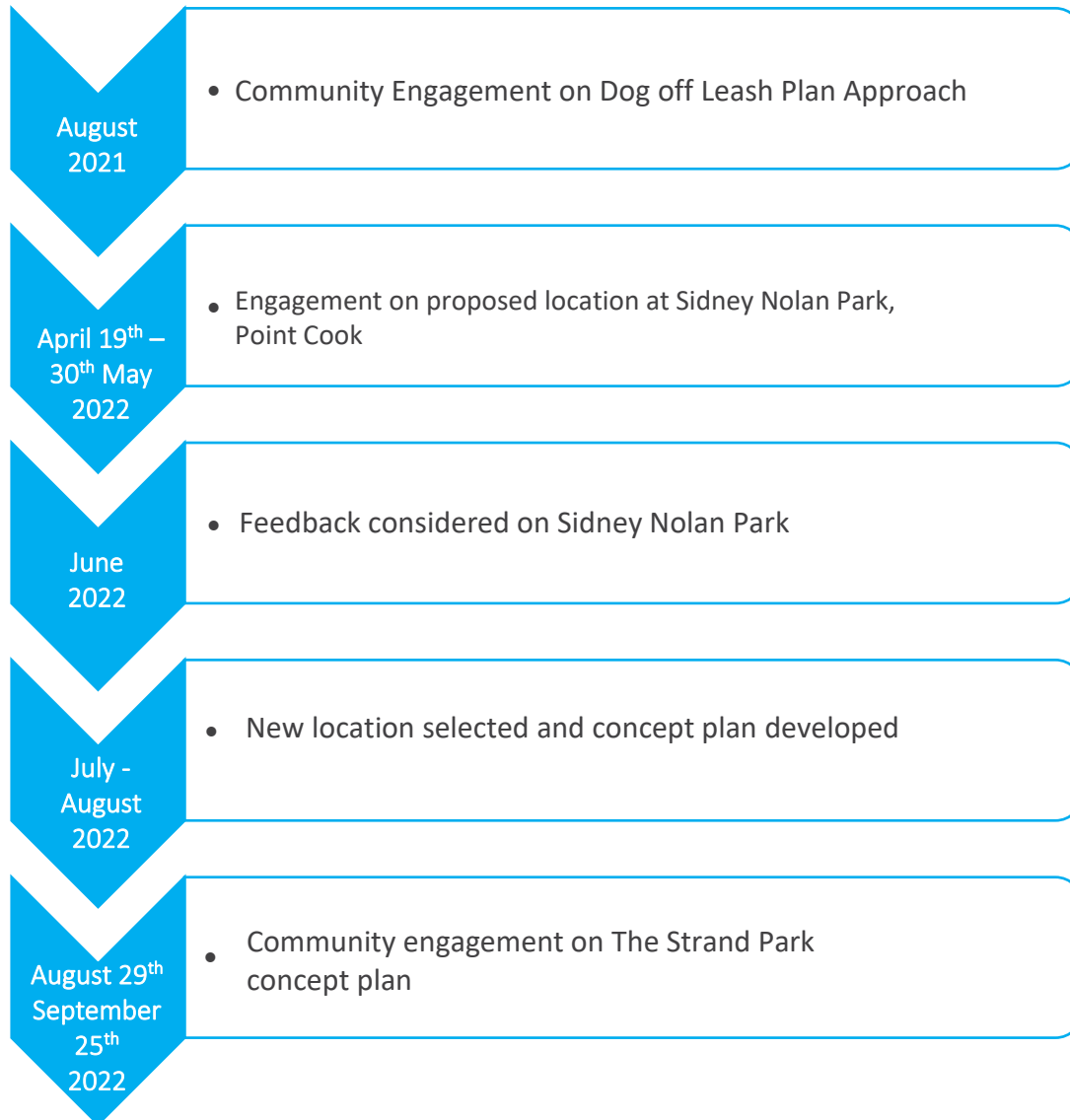
Council have developed a concept plan for the new location at The Strand Park.

Consultation on the concept plan will occur from 29<sup>th</sup> August through to 25<sup>th</sup> September 2022.

Subject to the outcomes of consultation, the fenced dog off-leash area at The Strand Park, Point Cook will be constructed by the end of June 2023.
