The Council has developed a comprehensive strategy that includes a thorough assessment of the current economic landscape, the challenges and how to address them. The need to develop the East Werribee Employment Precinct is very important to ensure jobs growth.	Identify priority industry sectors for investment attraction to support growth in employment opportunities for Wyndham's residents and highlight the critical need to retain and develop East Werribee Employment Precinct.

Is there anything we might have missed that you think should be included?	Would be important to expand Tertiary Education to also include TAFE as a priority sector. Council should have a greater focus on buying from Wyndham based businesses including the tender process.	Redefined the priority sector to be known as Higher Education, TAFE and Further Education which incorporates both university and TAFE offerings. Identified as a Year 1 action, the development and implementation of a Buy Local campaign.




We Asked	You Said	We did
Is there anything else you want to tell us?	It is important to have a strong focus on the Agriculture sector in Wyndham and the development of a Strategy would assist. Improving the diversification of industries in Wyndham is needed to match the skill set and grow local employment opportunities of the resident workforce.	The development of a detailed Agribusiness Strategy is identified as an important and necessary action and is included in the Economic Development Strategy. Agribusiness is included as a Priority Industry Sector. The Strategy notes the importance of the development of East Werribee into an employment precinct which will catalyse growth in a diverse range of industry sectors including Professional Services, Advanced Manufacture, Health, Research and Education among others.

NEXT STEPS:

• Council will use the feedback provided by this consultation to finalise the Strategy. The new Economic Development Strategy will be adopted on 20 December 2022 and will provide the framework and actions with respect to delivering economic prosperity and jobs growth for Wyndham.
