Aquarius Street Reserve Upgrade





PROJECT BACKGROUND

Aquarius Street reserve has been identified as requiring a play space upgrade to a district-level facility for longer stay opportunities and to better cater for residents in the surrounding neighborhood.

Each year Wyndham City Council undertakes upgrades to improve the condition and aesthetics of its Open Space network. Aquarius Street reserve has been identified as requiring play space and park upgrades to provide a more diverse range of recreational opportunities for our community.

The purpose of the engagement:

- To gather an understanding of how the community utilises the space;
- \circ Seek feedback from the community on the proposed concept design; and
- o Determine the level of support for the proposed layout and inclusions in the concept.

We will be adding two additional springers to the playground There will be two bins installed at the park near the BBQ and picnic area. Sheoaks will be thinned out with nature play to be added Toilets are scheduled to be cleaned and locked daily
