HELP US NAME OUR NEW COMMUNITY CENTRES

COMMUNITY ENGAGEMENT REPORT





August 2023



PROJECT BACKGROUND:

In April 2023, council adopted a new Geographic Naming Policy to support the principles and procedures outlined in the Naming rules for places in Victoria (the naming rules). The policy aims to provide a consistent approach to geographic naming requests within the municipality of Wyndham and to ensure that all Wyndham features, localities and roads are appropriately named. The policy identifies the key considerations for Council when deliberating on geographic naming requests, with an endeavour to preserve the heritage, culture and identity of Wyndham City.

Between 19 June 2023 and 16 July 2023, we asked the community to share their views on naming the two new community centres coming to Wyndham as per the Geographic Naming Policy. The two new centres are known as Black Forest Road South Community Centre and Truganina (Elements) Community Centre.

Engagement was undertaken via The Loop and six pop up engagement sessions were offered at locations close to the future centres to support face to face participation. The community engagement was supported by an extensive Communications Plan that incorporated print and social media in various formats and across multiple platforms, including- Wyndham City Facebook and Instagram with over 3,400 postcards delivered to nearby residents.

The new community centres have been identified as critical infrastructure required to provide services to the growing community.

Both centres are currently under construction.

In 2024 the Black Forest Road South Community Centre (interim name) at 104 Shipwright Parade Werribee will offer maternal and child health and community spaces for programs, events and activities, with three and four-year-old kindergarten commencing in 2025.

From 2024 Truganina Community Centre (interim name) at 1 Everton Drive will offer a library lounge, maternal and child health and community spaces for programs, events and activities, with three and four-year-old kindergarten commencing in 2025. This centre to be designed and constructed sustainably to be carbon neutral in operation and all-electric, targeting a 5-star Green Star rating.





- Linking the name to a place
- Recognition and use of Traditional Owner languages
- Gender equality
- Using commemorative names

Name suggestions

A number of name suggestions for each centre were provided and these names have been assessed by Council officers and Geographic Names Victoria for compliance with the preferred naming theme and the Naming Rules for Places in Victoria 2022. An additional name for each centre has also been proposed by Council officers for the purpose of further community consultation.

When linking a name to a place, the naming rules require that the name:

- should be relevant to the local area
- must be approved by the relevant Registered Aboriginal Party (RAP) if the name relates to Traditional Owner language
- should not be an estate name to avoid future ambiguity, for example, Harpley
- if named after a person, that person should have a strong association to the area for at least 25 years. The names of people who are still alive must be avoided because community attitudes and opinions can change over time



It is proposed that the following compliant names be put to voting poll to seek a preferred name from the community for each centre.

Werribee - 104 Shipwright Parade, Werribee

- Shipwright Parade Community Centre (suggested twice via The Loop)
 - The Community Centre is located at 104 Shipwright Parade, Werribee and this name reflects its specific location on Shipwright Parade
- Lollypop Creek Community Centre (suggested 10 times via The Loop)
 - The Community Centre is located in the vicinity (within 5 km) of Lollypop Creek, and will be housed next door to the Lollypop Creek Primary School
- Ironbark Community Centre
 - The Ironbark is a distinctive native Australian tree common to the Werribee area.
 - o This name is suggested by Council officers as an additional option for consideration

Truganina - 1 Everton Road, Truganina

- Truganina Community Centre (suggested seven times via The Loop)
 - o The Community Centre is located in the suburb of Truganina
 - o This will be the first community centre in Truganina
- Everton Road Community Centre (suggested three times via The Loop)
 - The Community Centre is located at 1 Everton Road Truganina and this name reflects its specific location on Everton Road
- Pimelea Community Centre
 - The centre is close to the Truganina Cemetery Conservation Reserve, which protects some of the best remaining Federally-listed grassland conservation areas including the critically endangered *Pimelea Spinescens* (Spiny Rice Flower), a small, pretty flowering shrub that Wyndham is lucky enough to have a few strong populations of in our conservation reserves
 - o This name is suggested by Council officers as a third option for consideration

NEXT STEPS:

- Council to consider the results of community engagement and the preferred naming theme and suggested names for each community centre at the Council meeting on 22 August 2023.
- A selection of proposed names to be put to a community vote during September 2023.
- Council will consider the preferred names and give public notice of the final proposed names in October 2023.
- Following public notification and consideration of any further community feedback it is expected that Council will resolve to adopt a final name for each community centre in November 2023.
- The names will be submitted to Geographic Names Victoria for registration and gazettal.



STAGES OF THE PROJECT

Community Engagement for preferred naming theme and name suggestions. June - July 2023 Council report recommending proposed names in preferred theme to be put to a community vote. August 2023 Community to vote on a selection of proposed names for each community centre. September 2023 Council to endorse final proposed names and 30 days October public notice to be given. 2023 Council to adopt the name for each community centre. **November** 2023
