PLANNING FOR THE FUTURE OF SOLDIERS RESERVE & THE COLLEGE ROAD PRECINCT COMMUNITY ENGAGEMENT REPORT

PROJECT BACKGROUND:

The purpose of this project was to seek community feedback in relation to the Soldiers Reserve and College Road precinct to help shape the future development of the precinct.

Community Consultation was open from 5 September – 2 October 2022 which highlighted a range of issues and opportunities for Council to consider, including:

- Usage and participation
- Quality of facilities
- Condition of assets
- Desired reserve Improvements

This report provides a summary of the consultation process and feedback received.


